

**Robinhood Archery Club
Meeting Minutes
March 2, 2010**

President Dave Kerschinske called the meeting to order at 7:10pm with 14 members present. Minutes of the January 26, 2010 meeting were approved as written. The Treasurer's report was approved. It was noted that \$2,500 was taken out of the CD last month to purchase new target butts for the Indoor Range.

Chris Johannesen reported that the IRS approved our application for Non-Profit status under the 501C4 regulations and must file Form 990 every year reporting income and expenses. Individual donations to our club are not tax deductible under 501C4. It is possible to create a sub-company exclusively for our educational classes which would qualify as a 501c3 organization, but all monies and equipment would need to be kept separate. Robinhood is not eligible for exemption from Nebraska state sales taxes, which is only allowable for religious, non-profit medical, non-profit day care, and educational groups. Next month, Chris will check into area Foundations and see if grants are available for 501c4 organizations with the goal of purchasing new equipment for the children's classes.

New target butts were purchased for the Indoor Range. Thanks to the crew who hauled them from Omaha and up the stairs: Josh DePatie, Gene Metschke, Cliff Huss, Troy Anzalone, Dave Strong, Bob McKelvey, JT Nabity, and Brad & Chris Johannesen. A HUGE thank you goes to Kevin Hernes who single-handedly changed out the old targets with the new!!! The old target butts are lined against the north wall and any club member is welcome to take one home, they still stop arrows but don't hold targets very well.

The Outdoor Range is still covered with snow; Frank will check it next month to see if the road is passable to get an idea for when to start outdoor league. Plans to make a bridge at Camp Calvin Crest will need to be looked at as soon as the weather allows.

Winter leagues and classes are going strong with great participation. The Thursday night Park & Rec children's league has 13 participants and ends March 18th. Friday night JOAD has 15 participants and runs through April 16th. The Monday night 300 league has completed 8 weeks and the Wednesday night league has completed six weeks.

Midland College will be using the club once a week, probably on Wednesday mornings for a few weeks. A Boy Scout troop will use the indoor range this Saturday. Donations were received to help the Holloway family whose son Austin, has undergone major surgery for Krohn's disease in the last month. A VISA check card will be purchased to add to the fast food gift cards, and the club will waive their dues for this year.

Discussion of the R100 to be held in July followed. Six club members will be needed to help with set up, take down, and running registration. Club flyers will be made and handed out at the R100 to promote the N100 also.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:55pm.
