Hello Robinhood members;

It is time to start thinking about bowhunting again. Our season starts in just over 2 weeks and I am really looking forward to getting out in the woods and hunting again. Talking to fellow hunters I find that many are setting out trail cameras and hanging stands, trying to get the jump on the season and being able to hit it when Sept 15th rolls around, I am the same way. I like going out and seeing tracks and the travel routes trying to get an idea where to be when I go out for the first time hunting. I had the hunting bow out and was shooting it and making sure all was ok. I have checked over my camo and safety harness and all is good to go, now I just have to be patient and wait. I can also practice shooting and making sure I am ready and won't have any equipment surprises show up and possibly ruin a hunt. There have been some season date and regulation changes made since last year so it's a good idea to review the regulations and added opportunities available this year.

Our club along with the city Parks and Rec Dept are the sponsors of the Monnich Park Archery Range. Driving by I see that it is constantly in use and I know many of you use that range also for practice, I am asking for you to adhere to the No Broadhead rule for shooting in the target bags and if you see anyone shooting broadheads into the bags to pleasantly remind them that Broadheads shot into the targets ruin the targets and most likely if the Broadhead is stuck in the middle of the bags you won't be able to pull it out and will lose your Broadhead and leave a dangerously sharp object in the bag that will ruin someone else's arrow or cause personal injury, as club member's we could keep an eye out and the bag targets that Robinhood bought for everyone to use will last as long as possible.

The last 3d of the year at Calvin Crest is coming up on Sept 11-12 and is the N-100. I hope everyone knows about this and plans to help out in some way. We will be setting up on Wed, Thurs and Friday evenings before the shoot along with club members from Golden Arrow and Prairie Bowmen for the 100 target N-100. This is going to be a big event and I would hope that enough club members help out that things go smoothly like they did for the R-100 at Branched Oak earlier in the summer.
